

TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY FACIAL AFFECT RESEARCH STUDY

Indiana University School of Medicine is looking for people with a traumatic brain injury (TBI) and a care-partner to participate in a research study on emotions and empathy.

Purpose of the Study:

We are testing a new remotely delivered intervention to improve emotion recognition and empathy after TBI

What the study involves:

- Telephone screening to determine you meet the criteria to participate
- Baseline and post-intervention assessments
- 12 remotely delivered computer-based training sessions designed to improve emotion recognition and empathy. A care-partner you identify will attend some of these sessions. The treatment will be delivered by a trained study member.

Participants will be paid for participation.

You may be eligible if you:

1. Have had a traumatic brain injury.
2. Had your brain injury at least 12 months ago (or longer).
3. Are 18 years of age or older.
4. Have a care-partner willing to participate in the study.
5. You or your care-partner believe it would be beneficial for you to improve your ability to better recognize how others are feeling and/or empathize with others.
6. You have access to a computer with a webcam and high-speed internet
